What is Academic Advising?

- → Academic Advising is a time that each student will meet with their counselor 1 on 1 to discuss courses for next year
- → You will review any graduation requirements remaining and SOL tests you may have to take in the spring
- → This is a great opportunity to talk about post-secondary goals, to help tailor your schedule and possible academy courses

New Classes for the 25-26 School Year

Data Science

Data Science provides an introduction to the principles of data science through exposure to big data, open-source tools, and relational database concepts to tackle data-intensive computing problems that impact society.

Social Media Marketing

Students explore principles, strategies, tools, and tactics related to consumers, branding, advertising, and promotions, and how success is measured in a digital and social media marketing campaign. Students also investigate business and marketing plans, as well as careers in digital and social media marketing.

☐ STEM Robotics

Students engage in the study of computers and microprocessors and their applications to manufacturing, transportation, and communication systems. Topics include computer equipment and operating systems, robotics, programming, control systems, and social/cultural impact of these technologies.



Changes to Current Courses

- AP Seminar 10th graders can now take this in place of English 10 (11th and 12th graders can still take it as an AP elective)
- AP Human Geography 9th graders can now take this in place of World History 1 (11th and 12th graders can still take it as an AP elective)
- All level 4 world language courses, level 3 and 4 theatre/tech theatre courses, and advanced visual & performing arts courses are now honors courses with a .5 GPA boost

Importance of balancing your schedule

- → Think about the other responsibilities and activities you do, and how that could affect the amount of time you have to complete homework, projects etc. Tally up hours spent in activities after school
- → <u>Do not just take an HN or AP for the GPA boost!</u> That boost won't be helpful if you do not do well in the class and will not look good to colleges
- → If you are currently in a standard level class with an A, and it is a subject you are genuinely interested in, an honors class might be worth trying
- → Take your teacher, counselor and/or case manager feedback seriously. They teach the content, know the demands of classes and also know your learning style and worth ethic


Schedule Change Information

- Course request changes are not guaranteed after the March 14th deadline.
 - Classes may close or be cancelled (if closed, then a waitlist will be created)
- Beginning of next year, students will have an opportunity during a prearranged window in early Sept to make schedule changes (no change requests are guaranteed)
- This is why it is important to do your research <u>now</u> and understand your limits, other expectations, etc. when picking classes. Choose wisely NOW


Fall 2024:

Adding Your Courses into SIS



- → Add your course requests in SIS before meeting with your counselor
- → This is a preliminary selection (not final)
- → You will review them with your counselor to make sure they are correct and appropriate for your plans and requirements
- → You need to also add TWO alternatives
- → SEARCH BY COURSE CODE (listed on the sheet)
- → DO NOT TYPE IN THE NAME. There are many courses by the same name that are likely not the one you want

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What if I am not in a Woodson history or PE class?

★ Your counselor has a list of students and will call you down through e-hall pass within the window

3. Do I have to bring anything?

★ If you did not turn it in, please bring your course selection sheet (students will turn these into their 8th period teacher on Feb 4)

2. What if I'm absent that day?

★ Your counselor will call you down another time (please wait for your counselor to contact you for a makeup appt)

4. Do I have to do anything ahead of time?

★ Please add your classes in SIS (see slide 11 for instructions)

Frequently Asked Questions

5. How do I take EPF online?

★ Tell your counselor you are interested in taking it over the summer when you meet and they can tell you how to register

7. What about Dual Enrollment?

★ If you plan to take a DE course, there will be steps you MUST take before the DE deadline to register (your counselor will review that with you during your advising meeting)

6. What if I want to take a summer class?

★ Students can take 1 summer class (2 if they are doing EPF self-directed). You must register on your own (registration link on the Summer Learning column of the Academic Advising padlet)
