

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Importance of Teacher Feedback

- Your teachers know how you learn and how you are as a student in the classroom
- They know the level of rigor and work that comes with their courses within their subjects
- It is important to listen to the feedback, whether it is positive or ways you can improve, because it can help you make more informed decisions.
- It is SO important to think about balance and level of rigor. As a student, you are more than just the classroom, we need time for activities, self care, family etc.

Questions to ask yourself- If thinking AP/HN

- Do you participate in class?
- Do you advocate for yourself when you need help?
- Do you stay after for extra help or utilize returns?
- Do you turn in your assignments on time?
- Do you attend class regularly?
- Are you passionate about the class (doing it for a GPA boost isn't a good reason)
- Are you motivated to do the work?
- Are you willing to do work outside of class or access a tutor?
