⇒ **Note that Dual Enrollment and AP classes are college courses that move at a faster pace and have additional assignments. Classes maintain two gradebooks--one using FCPS grading policies; the other using NOVA grading policies. NOVA records zeroes and may not allow retakes. To earn the 6 college credits, students must receive grades of A, B, C on the NOVA grading scale.*

⇒ **To qualify to take Dual Enrollment Spanish 4 or Latin, students must meet one of the following criteria: 1. Cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or higher; 2. PSAT - ERW score of 390 or higher; 3. SAT - ERW score of 480 or higher; 4. ACT - 18 or higher on both.*

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To receive an Advanced Diploma from Fairfax County Public Schools, students must take either (1) three years of the same language or (2) four years of two different languages (two years of one and two years of another)

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

Many colleges require that students take a World Language in high school. Studying another language enhances students' college admission qualifications and opens additional doors through activities and awards such as Honor Societies, internships, contests, and the opportunity to participate in the Governor's School. World Language study also improves vocabulary and writing skills in English.

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What is the sequence for World Languages?

SPANISH

Students with no previous knowledge of Spanish begin at Spanish 1. Students who have studied Spanish 1 or 1A AND IB in middle school and earned grades of A, B, or C should enroll in Spanish 2. Students who are successful in Spanish 2 will enroll in Spanish 3. Students who completed Spanish Immersion up to grade 8 should enroll in Spanish 3. Following Spanish 3, students should enroll in Spanish 4. We are offering regular Spanish 4 and Spanish 4 Dual Enrollment next year. Dual Enrollment is taught in conjunction with NOVA and students who are successful can potentially earn 6 college credits. Students continuing their study of Spanish past level 3 should **not** skip level 4, as it prepares them for AP Spanish Language and Spanish 5.

Students who passed the FCPS World Language Credit Exam in Spanish and received one credit should take Spanish 2; those who received two credits should take Spanish 3; those who received three credits should take Spanish 4 regular or Dual Enrollment.

Students who successfully complete Spanish 4 regular or Dual Enrollment may choose to enroll in either Spanish 5 or AP Spanish Language. AP Spanish Language follows the College Board AP curriculum, preparing students to take the AP exam and potentially earn college credit. Spanish 5 is an advanced class that does not require the workload of AP. Regular Spanish 4 and Spanish 5 students receive a .5 GPA boost (these courses are on a par with Honors courses); Dual Enrollment Spanish 4 students receive a 1.0 GPA boost; AP Spanish Language students receive a 1.0 GPA boost.

Students who speak Spanish at home should consider taking our placement exam so that we may recommend the best starting point for their study of Spanish in high school. To take the exam, please contact your counselor or the World Language Department Chair, Ms. Marcos, at kmmarcos@fcps.edu

FRENCH, GERMAN, LATIN, AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE

Students with no previous knowledge begin at Level 1. Students who pass level 1 of a language in middle school with a grade of A, B, or C should start at Level 2. Native speakers should contact their counselors to arrange a possible placement exam. Students will follow the sequence of levels in the chart on page 1 of this handout.

French students should take French 4 after French 3, rather than move directly to AP French. French 4 prepares students to do well on the AP French Language exam.

Students at regular level 4 of any language receive a .5 GPA boost (these courses are on a par with Honors classes). Dual Enrollment students receive a 1.0 GPA boost. Those who study AP French Language receive a 1.0 GPA boost.

*Note re Latin 4/5

We are offering regular Latin 4 and Latin 4 Dual Enrollment next year. Dual Enrollment is taught in conjunction with NOVA and students who are successful can potentially earn 6 college credits. Latin 5 will study the same material as Latin 4, but the material changes year to year.
